

## **Dietetic Internship with OMALS**

- Students completing their internship program within the Online Master of Agricultural and Life Sciences (OMALS) program are eligible for federal student loans.
- The federal loan process begins with filing the 2025-26 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
  - https://studentaid.gov
  - "FAFSA Form" tab
  - o VT School Code 003754
- There is no specific filing deadline, but we recommend you file when you submit your admissions application your first year and by April in subsequent years.
- You must meet all Title IV Federal Financial Aid eligibility requirements.
- Once we receive the FAFSA, we will review it and request additional information if needed.
- Financial aid cannot exceed your budget/Cost of Attendance (COA) which includes both direct (tuition/fees) and indirect costs (travel, personal, books & supplies, and housing/meals) for the academic year.
- Graduate students are eligible for up to \$20,500
  in the <u>Federal Unsubsidized loan</u> per academic
  year. This loan will accrue interest and will be
  offered split evenly between fall and spring
  semesters.
- The unsubsidized loan interest rate for 2025-2026 will not be set until June 2025. The current interest rate is 8.08%.
- Receipt of scholarships, tuition waivers or other aid may impact loan eligibility.
- You may accept or decline all or a portion of the unsubsidized loan offered to you. Your award notice will contain instructions for this process.
- The first time you borrow a federal loan at VT, you must complete 2 additional requirements on <a href="https://studentaid.gov">https://studentaid.gov</a> under the "Loans and Grants" tab:

- If you need additional funds you may want to consider the following options:
  - Federal Graduate PLUS Loan
  - Private Loans
- The 2025-26 FAFSA will determine financial aid eligibility for the fall 2025 and spring/summer 2026 semesters.
- Summer ends our academic year. If you wish to receive a federal loan for the upcoming summer (2025) term, please submit the 2024-25 FAFSA as soon as possible.
- You must be enrolled at least half-time (5 credits) to receive the federal unsubsidized loan and keep any prior federal loan(s) in deferment.

## **Dietetic Internship only**

- Students completing only the internship portion of the program are not eligible for federal loans or loan deferment and should not submit a FAFSA.
- The only aid option for students in this program is a <u>private loan</u>.
  - Private loans require an approved credit check and often a co-signer.
  - We recommend applying for the fall and spring semesters at the same time.
  - Funds will disburse directly to VT & will refund to you. The earliest refund is just before the start of classes.
  - Students pay program costs directly to the Continuing Education Office.
- Students will not qualify for a loan deferment for but may qualify for a forbearance.
  - In a forbearance, interest will accrue on all previously received federal loans.
- Students may also be able to request an economic hardship deferment with their <u>loan</u> servicer based on individual circumstances.
